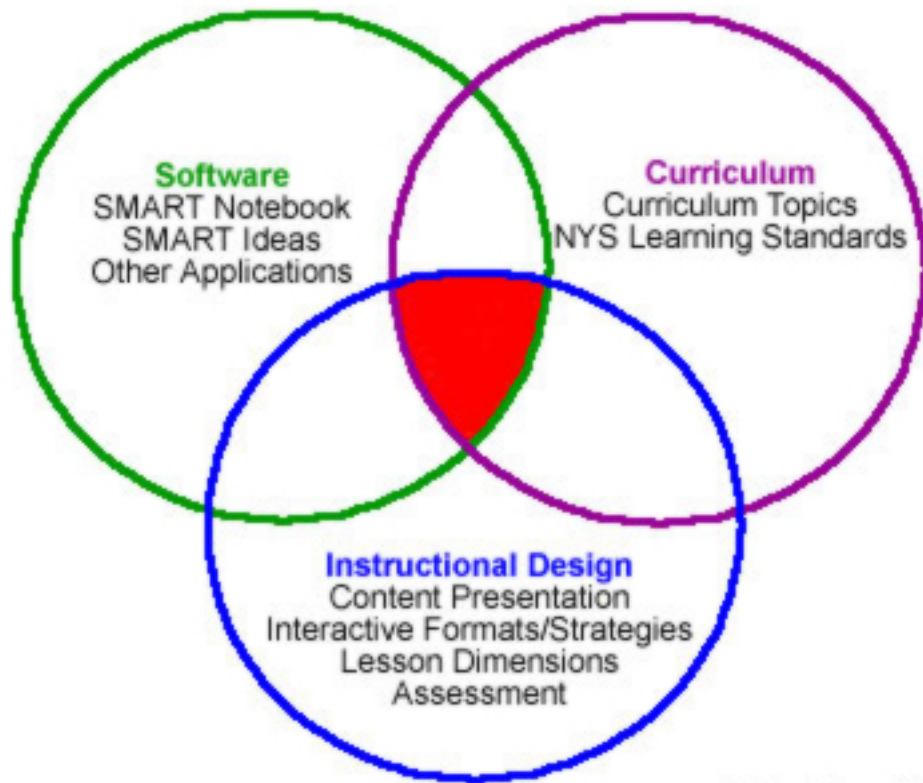


SMART Board Lesson Design

Software: Use SMART Notebook as the base application for delivering content and learning activities on the SMART Board. Include SMART Ideas and other software applications as additional instructional resources during the lesson.

Curriculum: Use classroom curriculum topics, concepts and generalizations from lesson plans, curriculum guides and other documents that address New York State Learning Standards as the content of the lessons.

Instructional Design: Use *content presentation tools* to present the content of the lesson. Use *interactive activity formats and strategies* to structure activities that stimulate student motivation and encourage participation in the lesson. Add *dimensions* to the lesson to provide a variety of resources that enhance the effectiveness of the lesson.
